

Mark 4:21-25

Living in the Light

Good Morning Church...

If you have your Bibles with you, please turn to Mark Chapter 4 as we continue our verse-by-verse study.

We will be in verses 21-25 today, with a message titled, “Living in the Light.”

I read a story... Many years ago, a lighthouse keeper was responsible for keeping a light burning along a very dangerous and rocky coastline.

Ships depended on that light to navigate safely through the perilous waters.

One season, as the economic downturn wreaked havoc on the neighboring community, the keeper received a request from a neighbor who needed oil for his lamp.

He was warned: “Please don’t tell anyone. This oil is meant to keep the ships safe at sea.”

But his brother-in-law ran out of oil, and he told him of the lighthouse keepers' oil.

He couldn't keep this kind of secret from his own family.

Well, of course, slowly but surely, word started to spread about the lighthouse keeper's generosity.

The keeper could not turn these people away, as they needed what seemed just like a little oil at a time.

He gave away small portions of the oil entrusted to him daily.

Eventually, the lighthouse grew dim as he tried to save what he could, but ultimately the carefully measured oil ran out before the delivery of the new could come.

The light went dark, and that very night, several ships crashed into the rocks.

Lives were lost, and an investigation ensued.

When the keeper was asked why the light went out, he began to explain all the good things he had done with the oil.

The response was simple, "You were not given the oil to do all those things. You were given the oil to keep the light burning."

It did not matter what good things he did; if he neglected the main thing he was put there for.

His stewardship was taken from him, and he could not be trusted with such a high calling any longer.

Jesus says here in Mark 4 that a lamp is not brought to be hidden under a basket or bed.

It is to be placed on a stand to receive light.

God has not revealed His truth to us so that we can conceal it, ignore it, or merely admire it.

He has given us His light so that we might live in it and let it shine before others.

Jesus will teach that with revelation comes responsibility.

The question is not whether we have received light, but what we are doing with the light we have been given.

Read the verses in their entirety with me, and we will come back through and break them apart.

Light Under a Basket

(Luke 8:16-18)

4:21 Also He said to them, "Is a lamp brought to be put under a basket or under a bed? Is it not to be set on a lampstand? **22** For there is nothing hidden which will not be revealed, nor has anything been kept secret but that it should come to light. **23** If anyone has ears to hear, let him hear."

24 Then He said to them, "Take heed what you hear. With the same measure you use, it will be measured to you; and to you who hear, more will be given. **25** For whoever has, to him more will be given; but whoever does not have, even what he has will be taken away from him."

To gain the fullest understanding of what Jesus is dealing with in our text, we need to back up a bit and consider what has been said before.

It is possible that in these verses we have a portion of the Sermon on the Mount, but on the other hand, we may well suppose that Jesus frequently used the same metaphors to enforce the truth of His messages.¹

Last week, we looked at the Parable of the Soils, which Jesus spoke about four types of soil, or conditions of a person's heart.

The Seed scattered is the Word of God on those soils.

First, there was the Seed that fell along the pathway.

That was the hard ground from those compacted dirt pathways.

This represented the heart of a person who hears the Word of God, but has no interest in it whatsoever.

They can even sit in our churches, sometimes dragged by a spouse, or even to challenge the preaching. Some people love a good fight.

But the hard-hearted person has no intention of hearing what's being taught in the message.

The Word bounces off them, and they leave this incredible meeting place unchanged, unaffected by the living God we worship.

The devil uses their pride to snatch any meaningful message from God's Word.

The second Seed fell on the rocky places, and had no depth to their heart, and so they received what is said, but life's pressures caused them to wither out and fade...

This is the person who is led through life by emotion, making decisions based on feelings, and they can get attached to our message of Truth through the emotional part of their being.

But when things get hard, and trials come, and long seasons of waiting, they cannot hang around... they need a change, and they move onto the next thing that excites their senses.

They will conclude "Christianity is good for you, but it did not work for me."

The third soil that the Seed encountered was the area among the weeds and thorns.

When the Seed is sown among the thorns and watered, the weeds grow with it, ultimately choking out the seedling's growth potential.

This represented "Life's worries, riches and pleasures..."

This person puts little work into the soil's preparation, and their heart remains divided between the things of God and this world.

With no investment in spiritual disciplines, the flesh always takes them astray.

The world chokes them out, and the deceitfulness of riches, and their growth is stunted.

The last soil, which I believe is the majority of you, is expository-craving churchgoers.

You are unique in Christendom... I hope you understand that... there are fewer and fewer churchgoers who are coming to Church for the simple teaching of God's Word.

It does seem there is a growing hunger in this generation for a less entertainment-driven church and more Biblically centered church.

But, you all are a good soil gathering, those willing to hear and respond and obey the Word of God.

We come to Christ for salvation, He freely offers us His Grace and Forgiveness.

We recognize we are sinners, lost, in a hopeless state apart from Jesus's cleansing work on the cross.

When we truly understand our fallen condition and the magnitude of God's Grace, and we repent and turn to Jesus, no longer looking to this world for our answers.

A person's heart is so changed that they will strive to grow deeper in faith and walk humbly with their God.

That person will come to church and open their Bibles in the morning with a heart ready to receive.

They will maintain this teachable spirit within.

Even when the pain of trials and the uncertainties of this world tear through their life, their roots are deep enough to stand through it all.

They **Psalm 1:3 shall be like a tree Planted by the rivers of water, that brings for its fruit in season, Whose leaf also shall not wither; And whatever he does shall prosper.**

And here, as Jesus finished this Parable of the Soils, He moves into another parable, to further expound on the Good Soil....

And it is always good practice to consider the context of any text before moving ahead.

Jesus now speaking to those from the Good Soil, who are Born Again, growing from this heart that is ready to receive God's Word, He now says in verse 21...

Light Under a Basket

(Luke 8:16-18)

4:21 Also He said to them, "Is a lamp brought to be put under a basket or under a bed? Is it not to be set on a lampstand?"

If a person sets out to light a lamp, they do it for illumination.

It is dark in the room or outside, and they put a light to that darkness, to rid themselves of it.

You don't light a light to conceal it; otherwise, you would keep it unlit.

Think about what Jesus is saying here... that the message of the Kingdom of Heaven must not be concealed or hidden, or given in secret.

It is to be proclaimed far and wide, openly and clearly, so that those who come in can see the light.

Jesus is telling His followers here not to slow down the Gospel or Good News, but to proclaim it openly.

A person has the Word of God growing in the Good Soil of their heart, and it transforms them, making their lives visible to others and testifying to God's power.

On Friday, my three girls and I were driving to VBS when a gentleman in a Chevy truck pulled up next to us at the stoplight on Apple Valley Road.

And he had his windows down, must have had a new sound system put in, the bass was booming, but I immediately heard lyrics about a woman's body, and I didn't think it was right for my daughters to hear it...

So, I rolled down my window to maybe have a little chat with homie...

But Daisy, in the back, said, "Man, that music is ugly," and she must have concluded I was rolling my window down for her plan, "Yes, Dad, let's blast some Christian music to overpower that ugly music...."

Her plan was better than mine because, as I thought about the different scenarios that could play out, some of them did not end so well.

So I turned up the Christian song we had on the radio...

It was Jeremy Camp singing, “We Give You Glory, Lifting up our hands and singing holy...”

Well, he never made eye contact with us, but we made sure our Jesus Music was heard over that dark, perverted stuff.

We drove off, and I told them about our text today, how we need to let the light shine over the darkness.

We are not to be ashamed of our message... and our lives can be a visible testimony of the power of the Living God.

As this becomes visible in us, God will use it to further His kingdom, and in effect, He shines His light through us into the darkness of this world with our lives.

Over in Matthew’s Gospel, from the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus gives another teaching on this...

Matt 5:13-16 "You are the salt of the earth; but if the salt loses its flavor, how shall it be seasoned? It is then

good for nothing but to be thrown out and trampled underfoot by men. **14** "You are the light of the world. A city that is set on a hill cannot be hidden. **15** Nor do they light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a lampstand, and it gives light to all *who are* in the house. **16** Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.

These four verses are pretty remarkable to consider.

Jesus speaks to our function as believers in this world.

To summarize them, Jesus is telling those of us who are true believers in Jesus Christ to have an influence for Him in this world.

The person who is led to live according to His Word is going to function in this decaying and dark world as salt and light.

Christian character, whether conscious or unconscious, impacts the people around us.

The Sixteenth-century poet John Donne famously wrote:

“No man is an island, Entire of itself, Every man is a piece of the continent, A part of the main.”²

Your actions in this world touch many people's lives; how you live matters in connection with this world.

Jesus shows us we are to have an influence on this world for God and for the Good laid out in His Word.

Bringing this idea into the home... Parents, Grandparents, husbands, and wives, what we are doing in our families matters immensely.

Are we having that eternal impact?

It does not have to be a daily devotion with your family that sets them on the right course; those are good, but it is much broader than that.

Look for opportunities to bring Jesus into everyday life...

Or they will do what many churchgoers do today... they live for Jesus here... do the church thing... but they have different compartments in their lives...

They have the church part, the work part, the social part...

Today, the church part is checked off... tonight, maybe a social checkmark at the bar...

Then tomorrow work, and we think the work thing is our thing... “God, we will catch you at the dinner prayer.”

But His light is to shine through every aspect of our lives, on the soccer field, in the store, at work, and at our social gatherings.

Teach your kids that God is not just present during devotional or prayer times.

Last Thursday, I bought ten tickets for our family to see Spider-Man... We brought Grandma and two friends because Mom was sick.

And we are getting our popcorn. I like to get a tin for the movies we see, and I noticed there were no popcorn tins for Spider-Man.

I inquired, and the guy said, “Well, sir, it comes out next month.”

I bought early tickets for a Thursday showing next month.

I saw the kids with snacks in hand, slushies already poured...

So, we were seeing a movie... I ran to the ticket booth, and the only thing we could see at that time was Supergirl.

It did not look interesting, but the kids were there to watch a movie...

I tried to play it up... we are still seeing a superhero movie.

Well, there was a little bit of cussing, and Supergirl was pub crawling to each planet like a college girl.

I tried to find the message of good against evil.

And we got through it...

I was sitting outside that night under the stars when Daisy came out... I said, "Did you like seeing the girl power in that movie?"

She said, "Dad, there was cussing in that movie."

I asked her, "How does it make you feel to hear it?"

She said, “Dad, when people do bad things or ugly things, it makes me feel icky inside.”

I asked her if she knew why... She said, “No.”

I told her, “Last year, at this time, you prayed for Jesus to forgive you of your sins, and you asked Him to come into your life.”

“Then you told the whole world that you are His, when you identified with Him in baptism last year.”

I explained to her that the Holy Spirit now indwells her, and when the ugliness of this world buffets us, we feel it.

I asked, “How do you feel when you tell a lie, or you do something you shouldn’t?”

She said, “Ugly inside...”

I told her that it is the Holy Spirit’s guiding influence in her life as a child of God.

We were passing a soccer ball back and forth...

Parents, here is a little hack I have found with my boys: keep something, a little ball, football, anything you can toss back and forth with your kids...

Some of my best talks with my children were just us connecting through tossing something back and forth, kicking a ball to one another... It puts you face-to-face, and their little hearts open up.

With Freedom, I find whatever object I can; sometimes, we throw a little plastic GI Joe back and forth.

But our greatest light needs to burn first in our homes, with our own family.

You may not see it immediately, but if you choose to shine brightly and genuinely in your home, the fruit will show up in your children's lives in the future.

I know some of you are in the season of sleepless nights, diapers, and it feels like you are dying.

I remember Jess and I having 3 in diapers at once, and we never felt like that season would end, that we were stuck forever in poopy diapers.

Now, the baby is five, and it is breezing past us so fast... and Sofia changed the diapers of the last two babies, so we cannot complain too much.

But seasons go fast, look for every opportunity you can to make everything into a lesson about their spiritual

life so that they can see Jesus everywhere, in your kids, or grandkids... or your neighbors' kids...

Teaching them the Word through experience is what Paul told Timothy was one of the greatest blessings of his own upbringing.

2 Timothy 3:14-15 But you must continue in the things which you have learned and been assured of, knowing from whom you have learned them, 15 and that from childhood you have known the Holy Scriptures, which can make you wise for salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus.

He learned from the Word of God and from the example of his mother and grandmother.

This is an important point... really for all of us to hear... People are watching us... they will know whether the light in us is real.

I read this article that recorded Woodrow Wilson's encounter at a barber shop:

“I was sitting in a barber chair when I became aware that a powerful personality had entered the room. A man had come quietly in upon the same errand as

myself to have his hair cut and sat in the chair next to me. Every word the man uttered showed a personal interest in the man who was cutting his hair. And before I got through with what was being done to me I was aware I had attended an evangelistic service, because Mr. D. L. Moody was in that chair. I purposely lingered in the room after he had left and noted the singular affect that his visit had brought upon the barber shop. They talked in undertones. They did not know his name, but they knew something had elevated their thoughts, and I felt that I left that place as I should have left a place of worship.”³

This is the kind of impact you can have on those around you... The Light can shine so brightly that God is glorified.

It is worth considering what Jesus prayed for His followers in John...

John 17:15-19 I do not pray that You should take them out of the world, but that You should keep them from the evil one. **16** They are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. **17** Sanctify them by Your truth. Your

word is truth. **18** As You sent Me into the world, I also have sent them into the world. **19** And for their sakes I sanctify Myself, that they also may be sanctified by the truth.

We are strategically placed in this world, in the place we live and work, to connect this lost world with the Love of God and the truth of His Message.

We are in this world, but not of this world....

He calls us to be lights, to allow His Light to shine through us...

The purpose of letting His light shine through us is not to bring glory to ourselves, but to our Father in heaven.

Bring glory to Him in your work ethic, in the way you carry yourself in the public sphere.

When we live this way, people are attracted to God rather than to us.

Our human heart craves attention, and all eyes on us, and the light we shine must be for the glory of God.

I saw a video of a very clever nun who talked about when she used to work as a waitress.

And her co-workers would use our Lord's Name in vain.

She said she never condemned, rebuked, or judged them; they were outside the faith and did not know better.

But every time someone would say, Jesus Christ's Name in a slanderous way... she would reply, "Oh, I know Him, and I love Him too."

She would smile... and carry on...

Over time, she said, they would mock her, then after a while, they would see that she meant it...

"Oh, I know Him, and I love Him too."

One day, one of her co-workers came in a fuss, shouting her Savior's name in anger over and over again, and she went straight into the bathroom shouting it...

The nun said, she shouted back across the restaurant, "I Love Him."

Over time, she said the demeanor of that place changed, and people over time stopped using her Savior's name as a curse word.

And eventually, her co-workers wanted to know more about this Jesus she was so in love with.

The light shone through her, affecting her entire workplace.

This is the kind of Light God wants people to shine in this world...

Look at the next two verses here, starting in verse 22...

22 For there is nothing hidden which will not be revealed, nor has anything been kept secret but that it should come to light. **23** If anyone has ears to hear, let him hear."

Verse 22 starts with the Greek conjunction word.

NT:1063_γάρ **gar** (gar); a primary particle; properly, assigning a reason (used in

argument, explanation, or intensification; often with other particles):⁴

It is used to express cause, inference, continuation, or to explain the previous phrase.

Jesus is telling us not to hide what He has entrusted to us, namely His Word and message of hope.

We do this because everything is supposed to be revealed about the Truth.

Now is the time for us to preach the Gospel and bring salvation to all of humanity.

Remember, last week, in our verses, Jesus told the disciples they had been given the secrets of the Kingdom.

Today, we are stewards of these mysteries.

The Apostle Paul states,

1 Cor. 4:1-2 Let a man so consider us, as servants of Christ and stewards of the mysteries of God. 2

Moreover it is required in stewards that one be found faithful.

The mystery was previously unknown; it is now revealed and open, and we must, as good stewards, declare it openly.

Jesus says of Himself, John 8:12, “I am the light of the world. He who follows Me shall not walk in darkness, but have the light of life.

Those who have His Light must now emulate it in our Christian living.

There is this article from 1974 in Christianity Today that published a testimony by a Soviet prisoner, “Koslov.”

This man had been thrown in the gulag for criminal activity. He writes... "While prisoners like myself were cursing ourselves, the camp, the authorities - while we opened up our veins, or stomachs, or hanged ourselves - the Christians (with sentences of 25 years) didn't despair. One could see Christ reflected in their faces. Their pure, upright life, deep faith and devotion to God, their gentleness and wonderful manliness became a

shining example of real life for thousands.” Kozlov, too, became a Christian and a leader among Russian believers.⁵

Think about the depths of what is recorded there.

How does a person get to this place?

Think of the things that bring you down in our culture... I am willing to bet you are a lot like me. I think the whole world is falling apart if I am not getting my way.

Someone cuts me off in traffic, “Oh, this cursed world, how long can I bear with you?”

A 25-year prison sentence for Christ, and they maintained their witness.

We, in the United States, should above all others be Christians who keep the lights on for those around us...

Paul wrote this:

1 Thess. 5:4-7 But you, brethren, are not in darkness, so that this Day should overtake you as a thief. 5 You are all sons of light and sons of the day. We are not of the night nor of darkness. 6 Therefore let us not sleep, as

others do, but let us watch and be sober. 7 For those who sleep, sleep at night, and those who get drunk are drunk at night.

We are not in darkness, which represents ignorance about these warnings of His return.

We are not ignorant about where History is headed.

We have been given the knowledge of the outcome of it all.

We know Jesus is coming for His Church... and this is not a moment for complacency but urgency.

We are children of the light... Is your lifestyle reflecting this?

Those who live like the night in darkness miss the importance of our light shining.

Do you notice things get pretty bad at night, under the cover of darkness, evil lurks.

Carousing, drunkenness, the endless party, and spiritual slumber dull us to the alertness we were called to live in before the world, and to influencing the world for good.

Paul makes it clear, **1 Thessalonians 5:8 But let us who are of the day be sober, putting on the breastplate of faith and love, and as a helmet the hope of salvation.**

Paul says, don't be intoxicated by this world; be sober. Think about this statement for a moment.

To be under the influence means we are inhibited by what we are taking into our lives.

Be sober, not just from drugs and alcohol, but worldly influence or emotional influence over the decisions of our lives.

We are to be spiritually minded.

Romans 8:5-6 For those who live according to the flesh set their minds on the things of the flesh, but those who live according to the Spirit, the things of the Spirit. 6 For to be carnally minded is death, but to be spiritually minded is life and peace.

In verse 23, Jesus says, "He who has ears to hear, let him hear."

And we will end with these two verses, verses 24-25...

24 Then He said to them, "Take heed what you hear. With the same measure you use, it will be measured to

you; and to you who hear, more will be given. 25 For whoever has, to him more will be given; but whoever does not have, even what he has will be taken away from him."

We are to listen up, hear what the Spirit is teaching us. Then Jesus says, "Take heed to what He is showing you."

Why do we need to pay so much attention to what we are hearing and doing?

I believe it is because the danger of self-deception is great in the human heart.

Our hearts can take on that pharisaic mindset, of not being good for you, but for me, it is okay.

The Pharisees thought they knew better than everyone else.

Jesus warned, "Take heed how you hear."

We are to **James 1:22 ... be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving ourselves."**

This is a pretty heavy reality considering what Jesus already said...

Mark 4:25 "For whoever has, to him more will be given; but whoever does not have, even what he has will be taken away from him."

Those who are nominal Christians, only by name, not by lifestyle, who never obeyed and put into practice the teachings of our God, could be in danger of hearing, "I never knew you."

The person who is careful to both hear and do will be given much more...

This is growth and maturity... Whatever you are going through today, learning and applying is what is preparing you for God's plan and purposes tomorrow.

When you are in the Word, listening to its teaching, prayerfully consider how it applies to you.

First, do a self-assessment, then you can elbow the person next to you.

Jesus has called us to be confident that we are hearing the Word of God.

The one who hears but does not listen to or apply it will have it taken away.

The opportunity to obey may be before you, but if you don't take it, you may never get that chance again.

Listen Church, our lives will be illuminated and used for His Kingdom purposes, filled with light and life.

When we were in Israel, we went to two lakes that the Jordan River flowed into.

The Sea of Galilee was full of fishing boats, life, and movement.

The other lake was the Dead Sea.

Everything you need to know about it in the name... It is dead; no life exists in it.

It is a stagnant body of water, and because there is no outlet, salt has built up in it.

Both lakes have the same water source flowing into them, but what keeps the other alive is that the water flows out as well.

Spiritual death comes to a stagnant life... There needs to be a healthy current coming in, and a steady stream going out.

We come alive in our Christian walk when we light up this world with God's Truth.

Think about the last time you got to lead someone to the Lord.

There is nothing more thrilling than watching a life changed from that moment.

A few months back, there was a hard gentleman here, who had just done some time, tattoos all over his body...

He heard me teach on the Supremacy of Christ... The message that morning gripped his heart...

He brought me into my office immediately after service, and told me how he had worshipped the gods of war, Ares, Pallos, and others...

He said, "If Christ is above them all, I want Him as my Lord and Savior."

I taught that Christ had supremacy, and the man who was a Supremist in prison, joined a much bigger gang that day...

He repented of sins, renounced his former gods, and turned to Christ his King.

Now, sometimes you wonder, did it take? Was that encounter real? Did Christ come into that man's life? He left the church that day, and I did not see him again for a while.

I got a call from him not too long ago. God has been doing some amazing things in his life... opened doors for employment, and he told me he moved up north after he asked Christ into his heart, until he and his girlfriend could get right before the Lord.

He told me he found a Church, and he is still all in...

He found out we are having a baptism today, so he made the journey down... and he will get baptized...

I found out yesterday that he and his girlfriend got married in Vegas, and before they get baptized, I will do their vows under the tree out there.

But every time I see Jesus change a life, I think to myself, there is nothing better, no great feeling, no greater peak in this existence than praying that prayer with someone, and watching the Holy Spirit indwell them, and change them in a way no program or method or man ever could.

This is what we live for... some churchgoers are missing out, because they are chasing the carrot of this world, that Satan holds out in front of them, thinking they will find their fulfillment.

How many of you workers here this week for VBS were so exhausted by Friday? Oh man, what labor and intense energy went into that event.

But none of it mattered when Pastor Jake gave that altar call, and all our children ran up there to give their lives to Jesus!

I don't know if he does it on purpose, but he did it last year. I love that he gets down with them on their level and leads them to Christ.

It makes the months and months of preparation, the blitz week of activity, all worth... I mean, I got tired watching you all!

But those of you who labor in that Children's Ministry every week, and you know this, you will get exhausted, maybe think about stepping down, then you pray with a little one to receive Christ...

And you know, this is why I am here on earth... this is what I am supposed to be doing...

If you ever led a family member to the Lord, a co-worker, a stranger in the store... You know what I am talking about; there is no higher plane to walk on than to see someone receive eternal life and be born again.

If you have never done this as a Christian, you see this morning, you are to let your light shine, church...

And you are.... But learn that this is your greatest duty in this life... Shine bright...

Remember the light house steward who forgot his purpose, “You were not given the oil to do all those things. You were given the oil to keep the light burning.”

It did not matter what good things he did; if he neglected the main thing he was put there for.

If you neglect what has been entrusted to you, it will be removed from you altogether.

Our brother Curtis, who was homeless when I arrived at this Church, used to come in and pray with the staff every day...

His prayer was the same every morning, “Lord, thank you that this Church is a Bright Light in this community and to the World.”

You all are bringing hope to a lost world... this is mission number one... be faithful stewards of this calling, because faithfulness yields an increase...

Be encouraged this morning, enjoy the baptism, because everyone who goes out there today is doing so because of the light you all shine in this community.

God is moving through you all... We are in tough ground... tilling away each week...

We are in a dark area... but that light is so visible in the darkness.

I love being a part of it all with you...

Let's pray...

If you want to join the bigger gang today... give your life to Jesus... repent of your sins... it is a great day to do it...
